



Consent and Release Agreement for Micropigmentation/ Cosmetic Tattooing

This form provides information to make an informed choice of whether or not to undergo a micropigmentation application.

This is a process of inserting pigments into the basal cell layer of the epidermis. Although semi-permanent this is a form of tattooing.

All instruments that enter the skin or come in contact with body fluids are sealed and sterilized before use and disposed of after use. Cross contamination guidelines are strictly adhered to.

Although micropigmentation is effective in most cases, NO guarantee can be made that a specific client and using a pencil or powder may still be needed. We have no control over what occurs during the healing process.

Generally, the results are excellent. However, a perfect result after one session is not a realistic expectation. It is usual and advised to expect a touch up after the healing is completed. Allow 4-6 weeks for healing time (healing time may vary)

Initially the color will appear much more vibrant or darker in the first few days. The color WILL lighten 30-50% from the first visit, during the healing time. Usually within 5-7 days your brows and eyeliner will lose 10-15% thickness, soften and look more natural. The pigment is semi-permanent and WILL fade over time and will need to be touch up through the years. Touch ups are usually performed every 1 to 2 years.

If you have had your eyebrows previously tattooed and are interested in a cover-up/re-work, we cannot guarantee results for cases such as these and we must approve that your eyebrows are workable during consultation. In some cases where the previous work is too dark, dense, or discolored, tattoo removal will be highly recommended before we begin the cover-up/re-work. Previously tattooed areas and cover-ups will almost always require additional appointments for best results.

Possible Risks, or complications

- Pain: There can be a certain amount of discomfort or pain even after the topical anesthetics has been used. Anesthetics work better on some people than others.
- Possible side effects: Minor and temporary bleeding, bruising and swelling. This should dissipate within 1- 5 days. Some people bruise or swell more than others. Ice packs may help reduce swelling. Those who are prone to cold sores may develop one following lip procedures. Proper pre and post care will be advised.
- Infection: Infection is very unusual but occasionally occur. Areas treated MUST be kept clean and only freshly cleaned hands should touch the areas. See “after care” sheet for instruction on care
- Uneven Pigmentation: This can result from poor healing, infection, bleeding, skin type, or many other causes. Your Follow up appointment will likely correct any uneven appearance.
- MRI: Pigments used in micropigmentaion contain inert oxides, a low level magnet may be required if you need to be scanned by an MRI machine. You must inform your technician of any tattoos or cosmetic tattooing.
- Anesthetics: Topical anesthetics are used to numb the area to be tattooed. Lidocaine, prilocaine, benzocaine, tetracaine, and or epinephrine are used. If you are allergic to any of these, please inform your technician.
- Asymmetry: Every effort will be made to avoid asymmetry but our facial features may not be symmetrical so adjustments may be needed during the follow up session to correct any unevenness

- I understand that implanted pigment color can slightly change or fade over time due to circumstances beyond your control and I will need to maintain the color with future applications.

- I understand that I will need more than one procedure to achieve my final goal. Touch-ups must be completed within 90 days of initial procedure in order to be considered a free follow-up. After 90 days touch-up fees will apply.
- I acknowledge it is not reasonably possible to my artist to determine whether I might have an allergic reaction to the pigments or ointments used in this process.

After care for Eyebrows

Please leave your brows alone for 48 hours. I have sprayed a liquid bandage on your eyebrows therefore they will be protected. It is ok to wash your face during these 48 hours but please don't get your cleanser on your eyebrows. After the 48 hours is up please follow the aftercare instructions as followed.

Using your fingertips, gently wash the area with unscented soap (ex. Dove) morning and night, for 7 days.

- 1. Apply a very thin layer of the aftercare gel I have given you with a cotton swab 3 times a day for 5 days.*
- 2. Avoid washcloths and scratching or picking at the tattoo during the healing process. (Healing time may vary)*
- 3. Avoid hot tubs, steam rooms, public pools, long hot showers, sweaty exercise, or submerging the tattoo in water for the first 10 days.*
- 4. Avoid direct sunlight or tanning beds for 2 weeks after receiving the tattoo.*
- 5. Avoid putting makeup on the area for the first week.*
- 6. Avoid facials, chemical peels, or microdermabrasion for 4 weeks.*

healing

- Immediately following your procedure, the tattooed area will appear to be darker and bolder in color and more sharply defined. This can last up to a week after the treatment while the initial healing process takes place. The treated area may feel a bit like sunburn afterwards but there should be minimal discomfort.*
- The complete healing process takes about 6 weeks, at which time the true color of the tattoo is evident. During this process, your tattoo will soften and lighten. Be patient, even if you think too much color has been lost, as your skin is still regenerating and naturally exfoliating. Wait at least 6 weeks to see the true color, as it seems to take on new strength, and it is only after 6 weeks that your touch-up/adjustment can be done.*

Eyeliner Micropigmentation Aftercare

Temporary side effects from micropigmentation include but are not limited to: redness, swelling, puffiness, bruising, dry patches and tenderness.

You should expect to lose approximately 1/3 of the initial color during the healing process. We have selected the optimal pigments for you with this in mind. In approximately six days it may appear too light. After about 10 days, the color will show more. It will appear softer when completely healed.

Day by day healing and what to expect

Day 1. The eyes will be swollen and sore, like you have been crying, with a heavier eye makeup look. For the first 3-4 days, the color is darker than it will appear when healed. Apply a light gloss of Aquaphor ointment sparingly to the treated areas with a clean fingertip. Too much ointment makes the swollen area too wet. Use the ointment in the morning and evening. A third application is fine if needed, but don't over use. Clean the eyes in the evening with clean water and a tissue.

Day 2. The eyelids are swollen for a few hours after waking up, still with heavier makeup look. When you wake up, refresh the treated area with cool water. Tissue dry and re-apply ointment. The eyes will be swollen and sore but will get better throughout the day. In the evening, gently cleanse with cool water, tissue dry, and re-apply ointment.

Day 3. Swelling decreases but is not gone entirely. There is a tight feeling. The top layers of skin begin to lift away. The soreness will become less as the treated area begins to exfoliate. A rough texture appears on the skin. Use a small amount of ointment if needed.

Day 4. There is a pinching feeling. Some itching is normal as the skin begins to flake. When the eyeliner area begins to exfoliate, do not pick at it! Discontinue ointment. It will flake off with the movement of the eye.

Day 5. Color is somewhat grayish and will take a few more days to clarify to full color. The pigmented area begins to shrink and soften in size and color over the next few days. Exfoliation completes. The color will appear a bit "frosty," but will clarify in a few days.

Day 6. The color has lightened from its initial overly-dark appearance. For the next few days, the color may now be lighter than what the final color will be.

Day 10. The final color begins to stabilize and show through. The color will continue to soften as the healing process completes.

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Lip Micropigmentation Aftercare

Lips pre-procedure: If you have any history of cold sores, fever blisters, or herpes simplex, you must contact your physician to obtain and take the proper prescription medication to prevent such outbreaks for at least 4 days before and after the procedure. Many physicians prescribe 12 capsules of 500mg Valtrex. Follow your physician's instructions

• Apply ice for the first 2-24 hours to reduce swelling. • Keep moist with of Aquaphor ointment or Liprotek for the next 3-4 days, and then switch to lip balm or lipstick with an SPF of 15 or greater as the sun tends to fade lip color quickly. • Lips may appear to have too much color in the days following the procedure. You may add makeup to soften the color. • Scars on the lips from fever blisters cause pigment removal.

Day 1. Swelling, tender, heavy, thick lipstick look with reddish brick color. For the first few days, the color is darker than it will appear when healed.

Day 2. Slight swelling, reddish, tender, with a slight metallic taste.

Day 3. Less swelling, thicker texture, sore, hot feeling before exfoliation with an orange color.

Day 4. Exfoliation begins, very chapped lips. The color will become lighter as the epidermis sloughs off. It will appear that you have lost all of your color, however, when your lips have healed completely, the dermal layer will gradually become darker.

Day 5. Very chapped but almost finished with first chapping stage.

Day 6. A soft, rich color begins to appear.

Days 7-13 Lip color disappears and the “frosty” 2nd chapping stage begins as a whitish gray haze on the lips.

Day 14. Color blooms from within more and more each day until day 21 (3 weeks post procedure).

Day 21. Healing complete. The color you see is the color that you have. Your lips will remain a bit dry for a month or two. Use a good lip balm and they will return to normal with full color.

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
